The Asian inspired landscape is a brilliant addition for the bamboo-like *Murdannia Keisak*. *Murdannia* is very fast-growing and requires frequent and comprehensive cutting. New shoots and replanted top shoots maintain the three groups.

*Eleocharis Parvula* in the back is floatingly revealed by the lower *Eleocharis 'Mini'* and incorporated in the front scenery.

## Technique

Aquarium:	IHM MÜLLER
Volume:	100 L
Light:	4 x 24 W T5 Daylight
Substrate:	Tropica substrate
Gravel:	Råda sand 0,8-1,2 mm
Decoration:	Lava rock, small redmoo roots
Filter:	Eheim pump 600 L/h
CO2:	Approx. 25 mg/L
Fertiliser (weekly):	30 mL Premium + 70 mL Specialised
Maintenance (hours per week):	1-2
